ORDER:-

In the G.O. 1st read above, rules relating to admission of students into Elementary Teacher Training Institutes /District Institutes of Education and Training through Common Entrance Test Rules, 2015 have been issued and accordingly, the rules came into force from the academic year 2015-16, and subsequently amended the said rules revising the schedule of DEECET vide G.O. 2nd read above.

2. In the reference 3rd read above, the Commissioner of School Education, A.P. has stated that in Andhra Pradesh State there are over 750 Teacher Education Institutes (TEIs) imparting Training program in Diploma in Elementary Education, including 13 in Government Sector and over 735 privately managed TEIs. There are over 65,000 seats in these TEIs. She has reported that from the past experience of conducting DEECET, certain instances are noticed that every year, the number of qualified candidates in DEECET are much lower than the number of seats available in various Teacher Education Institutes (TEIs) in the State and many seats are not getting filled up as students are not interested or not qualified in DEECET, despite reduction of marks. In view of the situation and based on the requests received, said rules are being relaxed. This is resulting on the academic year getting stretched and proper teaching course is not happening in the Private TEIs. As the closure of academic year is getting delayed, students are facing the problem of loss of one academic year to join further Teacher Education or different courses.

3. In order to streamline the DEECET admission process, the Commissioner of School Education, A.P. has proposed to reduce qualifying marks as prescribed in Rule 4 (ii) of DEECET Rules 2015 duly amending the Rules relating to admission of students into Elementary TEIs/ District Institutes of Education and Training through Common Entrance Test Rules, 2015 issued in G.O.Ms.No.30 School Education (Prog.II) Dept., dt.8.7.2015.

4. In the circumstance reported by the Commissioner of School Education, A.P., after careful examination of the matter, Government have decided to amend the rules relating to admission of students into Elementary Teacher Training Institutes /District Institutes of Education and Training through Common Entrance Test Rules, 2015. The following notification will be published in the Extra-Ordinary Issue of the Andhra Pradesh Gazette, dated:13.06.2019.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 3 and 15 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (Andhra Pradesh Act 5 of 1983) and Government hereby make the following amendment to the rules issued for admission of students into Elementary Teacher Training Institutes / District Institutes of Education and Training (DIET) through Common Entrance Test Rules -2015 issued vide G.O. 1st read above.

1. Under Eligibility Criteria for admission: rule 4 (ii) shall be substituted as follows:

<p><u>Rule 4(ii). Eligibility Criteria for Admission:</u></p> <p>Candidates should have secured a rank in DEECET conducted for the Academic Year concerned for admissions into Government DIETs and Private Elementary Teacher Training Institutions and should satisfy the Educational criteria prescribed for the course as shown at (iii) below. For obtaining a DEECET rank candidates belonging to “OC” and “BC” communities shall secure minimum 50% marks in DEECET. For Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and Physically Challenged candidates the minimum qualifying marks for allotment at seats reserved under the respective categories will be 45%. That is to say candidates belonging to SC and ST communities should secure 50% of marks for consideration against seats under OC/NCC/CAP/Sports category.</p>	<p><u>Rule 4(ii) Eligibility Criteria for Admission:</u></p> <p>Candidates should have secured a rank in DEECET conducted for the Academic Year concerned for admissions into Government DIETs and Private Elementary Teacher Training Institutions and should satisfy the educational criteria prescribed for the course as shown at (iii) below. For obtaining a DEECET rank candidates belonging to “OC” and “BC” communities shall secure minimum 35% marks in DEECET. For Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Physically Challenged candidates the minimum qualifying marks for allotment of seats reserved under the respective Categories will be 25%. That is to say candidates belonging to SC and ST communities should secure 35% of marks for consideration against seats under OC / NCC / CAP/ Sports category.</p>
